# INNIS ARDEN BOARD MEETING MINUTES June 11, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 PM by President Easton Craft. Board members present: Easton Craft, Maggie Taber, Cindy Esselman, Dave Fosmire, Steve Johnston, Jeff Gough, Jim McCulloch, and BJ Oneal.

Approved June meeting agenda and May meeting minutes (with no updates/edits).

## PRESIDENT, Easton Craft -

# **Carlson litigation:**

On May 17, 2019 the Court dismissed <u>all</u> of Carlson's claims against Defendants and the Club (which intervened in order to protect the Covenants). The dismissal was <u>with prejudice</u>, meaning the claims cannot be brought again. The Court further held that monetary sanctions in the form of reasonable attorney's fees to be paid by Carlson were warranted because his claims were deemed legally frivolous. The amount of the sanctions/attorney's fees award will be determined via a subsequent hearing.

To recap what was at stake with regard to Carlson's claims, Carlson wanted the Court to:

- Sideline the Club's internal compliance process and leave individual Club members to have to go to Court every time;
- o Restrict which members (lots) are entitled to enforce the Covenants;
- o Limit when fines could be imposed for noncompliance;
- o Effectively repeal Covenants 10 and 11 at least as to vegetation;
- Eliminate the Bylaw requirement that any court challenge to a Club compliance decision must be brought within 21 days of issuance (leaving compliance decisions open to attack for years after they are rendered (and meanwhile no compliance);
- o Impose a doctrine, barring members from seeking tree/vegetation compliance if the member's lot is not in compliance with <u>all</u> Covenants, not just Covenants having to do with vegetation. (So, for example, if you had a noncompliant shed, or a home business, or anything not allowed under the Covenants, then you could not ask for compliance to address view obstruction by your neighbor's trees.

Carlson recently filed a motion asking the Court to reconsider its ruling. The Court has asked the Club to respond. The Club's Response is due June 11th. Carlson can submit a Reply on June 12th. The Court has indicated it will decide the Motion for Reconsideration on June 13. The Club's attorneys believe that Carlson's Motion for Reconsideration should be denied, and that the compliance process should at long last be underway this summer on the Carlson lot.

The Court did not rule on May 17th on the Club's counterclaims <u>against</u> Carlson. The trial date on those claims has been continued several months to allow time to see if those claims can be decided prior to an actual trial.

# **Storm Creek:**

Steve Johnston, Peter Eglick, and Easton Craft attended a meeting on June 6th at Shoreline City Hall about Storm Creek. City and Ronald Wastewater representatives were in attendance along with Innis Arden members who own property along Storm Creek and their attorney.

As noted last month, the City is attempting to obtain grant funding from the King County Flood District for Storm Creek work. The grant would be for a substantial sum and potentially pay for up to half of the approximately million-dollar cost of the work. Per the City's request, the Club has prepared for submission to the Flood District a letter of support for the grant application. Approval of the grant would be a significant milestone in resolution of concerns about Storm Creek.

## **Hjelle**:

Hjelle's lawyer has not provided a substantive response to a late May request by Club counsel for a status report on submission of applications to the City. The Club will continue monitoring.

## Tynan:

Tynan was given until June 15th to deal with the blackberry bushes - the other vegetation / trees have been in compliance for some time now.

Assuming all is progressing in terms of compliance, E&W will send a letter and take steps to wrap up the lawsuit

#### **Reserve Trees:**

The Club is still awaiting a formal proposal from the City for vegetation management plan that includes view preservation.

We have received an updated Swim Club Loan Guaranty from Washington Trust Bank that, at least initially, appears more aligned with our agreed upon expectations. We will be reviewing the agreement in the coming days, working toward an executable version.

At the close of March, the Club Operating Checking balance was \$41,813, the Collections Savings balance was \$262,159 and the Asset Reserve Savings was \$277,110.

Income was \$1,395 with refunds at \$725.
